

Andy has performed in several Frayed Knot productions including Marreau, Jerusalem, Talking Heads, and Oscar the musical Other roles with various societies include Serge in Art, Mozart in Amadeus, Henry Higgins in My Fair Lady,



Charlie in Stones in his Pockets, Ken Harrison in Whose Life is it Anyway? Nathan Detroit in Guys and Dolls, David in Company, Hysterium in A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum, Cliff in Cabaret, Billy Fisher in Billy Liar, Fagin in Oliver and Squire Faulkland in The Rivals. He has also done a lot of Shakespeare, Panto, and musical review.

He also directs regularly, with over 20 productions so far on the list. Also a fight director, he will be putting some 20 would-be medieval soldiers through their paces with sword and mace in Henry IV parts 1 and 2 later this year.

In addition to such larks he is a Podiatrist and voice actor.

He has lent his vocal pleasantries to many adverts and corporate training productions. He is highly delighted to be in a new radio production of Anthony Burgess' A Clockwork Orange which will be broadcast early next year.

BIRECTORS NOTE

Frayed Knot's reputation for comedy is unparalleled, locally. Equally when a gripping drama is produced its sheer emotional impact is felt around the Court Theatre long after its run and after the success of Peter Whelan's Accrington Pals in November, I felt FKTC was ready to tackle a fresh challenge. Something high-concept, off the wall, dangerous and all too familiar.

1984 has gnawed at me since I was first made aware of it. It's likely you've felt the same thing.

It insists on gnarledly protruding into popular culture and our everyday lexicon. Big Brother, Room 101 and The Thought Police have become so much more than words on a page or concepts in the mind of George Orwell, they've become a glossary for the the chicanery of modern life... as well as being highly popular prime time TV shows in the case of the first two.

Orwell's dystopian masterpiece proves it's prescience on an alarmingly regular basis and still crackles with the same power and viscerality it had when it was first published almost 70 years ago. Now in the age of surveillance, censorship and alternative facts, what Orwell originally intended as a cautionary tale now resembles an instruction manual.

He failed to predict, however, that the ones buying the cameras, redefining 'fact' and monitoring each others' speech would be ourselves. It is now arguably more relevant today than it has ever been. And who knows, in 70 years to come, they may be saying just the same.
